This half term in Year 2 we will be learning...

Literacy

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Children will be taught Literacy on a daily basis with an hour lesson each day. We will be looking at non-fiction texts and writing non-chronological reports.

Numeracy

Children will continue developing their skills in counting, partitioning and calculating as well as mental calculation strategies for addition and subtraction. They will learn multiplication tables for the 2, 5, 10, 3 and then 4 times tables. They will also explore data handling, measures, shape and number patterns and problem solving. They will begin to apply number facts such as addition facts to 10, doubles and halves to word problems.


History

History will form a major part of our topic this half term. The children will learn about significant events and celebrations within their own lives. They will also learn how events beyond living memory are significant nationally/internationally (e.g. the Gunpowder plot, Armistice Day) and how they are commemorated through festivals and annual events.

Music

Children will have the opportunity to listen to music and learn, practise and perform songs relating to the celebrations we will study.

P.E

The children will continue to develop multi-skills including teamwork tactics and ball skills. They will also work with a sports partnership teacher learning gymnastics.

Art and DT

In Art children will explore a range of different painting techniques. In DT they will experiment with design ideas and make small scale models.

ICT

In ICT the children will continue to learn about moving pictures and how to create a story sequence incorporating text, pictures and sound.

R.E and PSCHE In R.E. we will be learning about celebrations that are important to Christians and how these significant occasions are recognised in Church.

In PSCHE we will use stories and whole class discussion to reflect upon a range of issues linked to celebrations.
