History & Geography

Constructing our knowledge of the past through a range of sources, Year 6 will be exploring what life was like in the Victorian era for both the rich and poor. We will examine how the Industrial Revolution changed Britain and our geography work will focus on the British Empire.



Science

During Autumn term one, we will study **Living Things and their Habitats**, classifying living things - including
microorganisms, plants and animals - based on their
observable characteristics. In Autumn term two, we will explore **Evolution and Inheritance**, learning to recognise that living
things have changed over time and that fossils provide
information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions
of years ago. We will research the work of **Charles Darwin** and *The Origin of Species* which was published in the Victorian
times.

This term, we will be studying pattern, reflection and tessellation through a study on the work of Victorian artist and textile designer, **William Morris**.
