

<u>English</u> In English, we will start with a short writing unit linked to our residential before we move on to studying Shakespeare. We will explore the themes, language and characters across a number of plays and link our reading, grammar and writing opportunities to the Shakespeare texts. We will even perform at the Northern Staae!

TUDORS

RE

Our first topic in RE asks us the question... What does it mean if God is loving and holy? It will give us the opportunity to thoughtfully consider and compare different viewpoints and explore our own concepts of faith more deeply.

<u>Science</u>

In science, we will explore the parts of a flower to link with our Tudor topic. We will discover how flowers reproduce and look at the life cycle of plants. <u>History and Geography</u> We will explore the life and times of the Terrible Tudors. We will look at the War of the Roses, the monarchy and what artefacts tell us about Tudor life. In geography, we will look at the findings of Tudor explorers and consider how maps and atlases have changed.

> <u>DT</u> We will learn all about the traditional Tudor Rose. We will design and create a Tudor purse with an embroidered rose.

<u>Music</u>

We will continue to work hard with Mrs Milner as well as incorporating music into our Shakespeare performance. <u>Maths</u> In maths, we will ensure that we have a secure understanding of place value up to 1,000,000 before moving on to think about decimals, rounding and angles.

Some key information about Year 5
