Morning tasks	<p>Practise this week's spellings using look, cover, write, check method. Notice how they are opposite to those describing Scrooge: ruddy, cheerful, all a glow, eyes sparkled. Use Dickens's description of Scrooge as a basis for writing your own character description of Fred.</p>

Go through the information about her reign: what she did on a daily basis; her marriage to Prince Albert; her children; the death of her husband; her later years. What have we found out about Queen Victoria's personality so far?
