Consonants *Say the pure sounds (do not add 'uh').*

Vowels *Say the sounds in and out of order.*

Read in Fred Talk (pure sounds).

when catch drink munch

green knee creep feet street three

Read in syllables.

a`sleep → asleep

grem`lin → gremlin

greed`y → greedy

sogg`y → soggy

yumm`y → yummm`y

dish`cloth → dishcloth

coff`ee → coff ee

sett`ee → sett ee

Read the root word first and then with the ending.

crack → cracked

sit → sitting

keep → keeps

Soggy crusts **to** munch, yummy slops **to** drink!

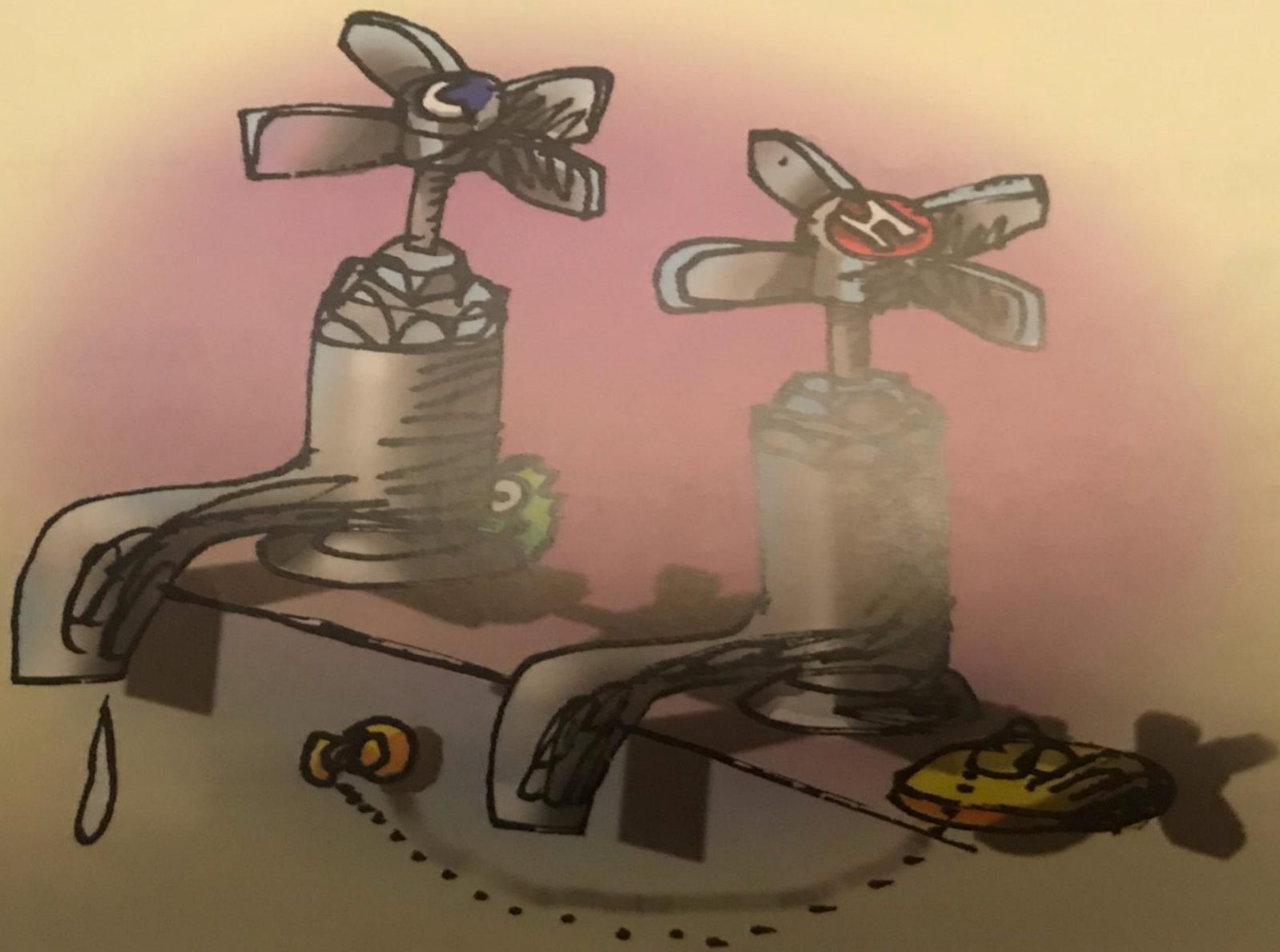


When Sam is sitting on **the** settee
