The first one has been done for you.

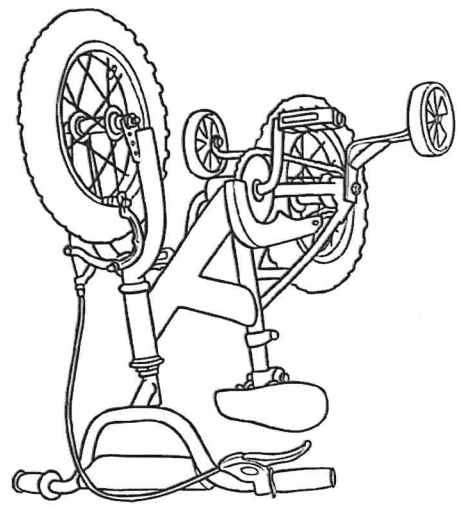
a) Conor is looking at the bike which belongs to Isla.

d) The wheels that belong to the car splashed through the puddles on the road.

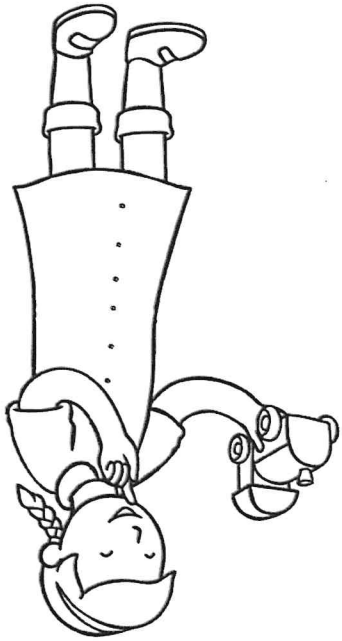

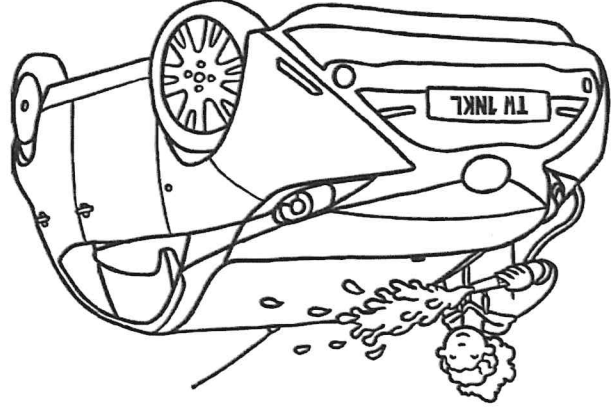

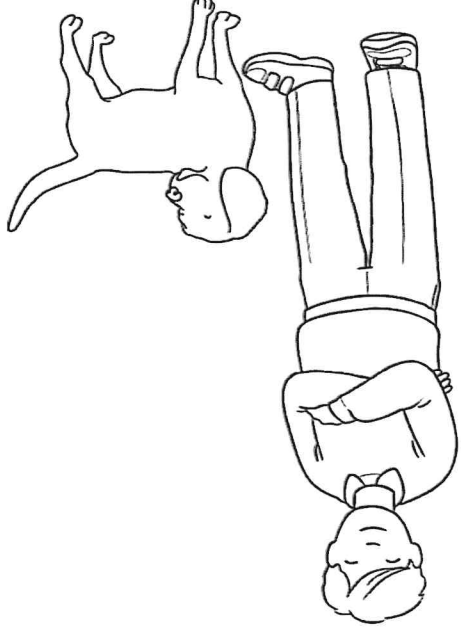
