


Geography

In geography, we will be investigating the geographical similarities and differences of a region of the United Kingdom and a region within North America, concentrating on key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities. We will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.



Science In our electricity unit, the children will compare and give reasons for variations in how components function.

This will include: the brightness of bulbs, the volume of buzzers and the on/off position of switches and we will learn to use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.



Art

This term, we will be exploring the 'Pop Art' movement, including American artist studies of Warhol and Lichtenstein, who challenged traditional fine art. We will also recreate some of Georgia O'Keefe's .American landscapes.



Music

We will continue our weekly music sessions with Mrs. Milner with a focus on composing and performing our own songs. These will be used as the score for our animation projects!

Year 6 will continue their weekly NUFC PE lessons and in class we will be focussing on athletics leading up to Sport's Day.




Maths

This half term we will be reviewing and consolidating our knowledge of fractions and mixed numbers, including calculating with fractions. We will then be focusing on some mathematical projects. The projects have been designed to explore maths in real life contexts and provide an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2.

RE & PSHCE

In PSHCE, we will be focussing on relationships, growing up and puberty in preparation for our transition to High School. In RE, we will be discussing the question, 'What kind of King is Jesus?'

Computing Our computing unit this half term will be 'animation' and we are excited to be working with the Haltwhistle Film Project!



MFL

In French this term we will continue to broaden our vocabulary and develop our ability to understand new words and phrases. We will continue to communicate with our virtual pen pals from Jean Vilar Primary School.

English

Our work over the autumn term will centre around the novel 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, which is set in Texas. We will be exploring the themes, plot, setting and characters during our English lessons and our spelling, punctuation and grammar objectives will be taught within the context of the story. Our non-fiction work will explore the wildlife we encounter in the novel as well as the social and cultural aspects of American history which are important to the plot, such as the Civil Rights Movement.
