Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will be encouraged to talk in groups, show interest and consider consequences. Children will learn to take turns and understand the need for agreed codes of behaviour. Children will learn to;

- Build constructive and respectful relationships
- Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge
- Know and talk about health and wellbeing including sensible amounts of screen time, having a good sleep routine, healthy eating
- Work as part of a group or class, taking turns and sharing fairly
- Dress and undress independently (coats and waterproofs for outdoor learning) Houses and Homes
- Select and use activities and resources independently

Communication and Language

During this topic, children will enjoy listening to and using spoken and written language, and readily turn to it in their play. They will learn to interact with others, negotiating plans and activities and taking turns in conversation and will be encouraged to speak clearly and audibly with confidence and control.

Literacv

Children will listen to and explore selected non-fiction, fiction and poetry texts, responding to what they have heard by relevant comments, guestions or actions. Children will continue to learn to blend phonemes to read simple words and to learn some words by sight. They will continue to practise letter formation patterns and how to accurately write their names.

- Use everyday words to describe position
- Name and describe common 2D and 3D shapes
- Use appropriate language to compare quantities
- Subitise numbers up to 6 (dice patterns)
- Use a tally chart to collect data

Understanding of the World

This topic offers many opportunities for the children to make comparisons about where they and others live. They can explore the differences and similarities between homes around the world and of the present and the past. Children will:

- Investigate pictures, stories and artefacts identifying similarities and differences
- Have hands on experience visiting the local area to explore different types of buildings and places of interest
- Explore basic chronology recognising that things happened before they were born
- Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries
