History & Geography

Constructing our knowledge of the past through a range of sources, Year 6 will be exploring what life was like in the Victorian era for both the rich and poor. We will examine how the Industrial Revolution changed Britain and our geography work will focus on the British Empire.



During this half term, we will explore **Evolution and Inheritance**, learning to recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. We will research the work of **Charles Darwin** and *The Origin of Species* which was published in the Victorian times.

Art & DT

This term, we will be experimenting with pattern, reflection & tessellation, and exploring printing techniques through a study on the work of Victorian artist and textile designer, **William Morris**.

Computing

During this half term we will learn about what the internet consists of. We will research and find out about the age of the internet and begin to think about what the future might hold.



PE: Year 6 will continue their weekly swimming sessions at Ponteland Leisure Centre up until Christmas. In our class session, we will be commencing our Multi-Skills unit with our NUFC coach.

Maths

This term in maths we will learn about the order of operations, as well as practising our estimation and **reasoning** skills. We will be focussing in depth on **fractions**; simplifying, comparing, ordering and calculating, as well as converting between fractions and mixed numbers and finding fractions of amounts. We will also look at some **geometry** work around position and direction.
