

Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium 2020 / 2021

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided funding to the school through the Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium. The Government vision for the Premium is:

ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. This will be the legacy to the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

This means that schools should use the premium to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that school already offers;
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years and link to the premium grant conditions and vision.

Objective: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against 5 key indicators:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30mins of physical activity a day at school (kick-starting healthy active lifestyles);
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement;
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- Increased participation in competitive sport.
