
#### New Friends and a Busy Week in Nursery




















This week Reception have been thinking about Houses and Homes.

What a super first week back everyone!













# **Super Maths in Year 1**

This week in Year 1 we have been using a range of manipulatives to help us to understand and represent numbers up to 20. Great counting Year 1!

Year 2 have been learning about free standing, stable structures in Design Technology. By using buttresses or making their base wider; they were able to make their structure more stable. ### Going to Heddon School in the 1880s!

Year 3 have started their new History topic looking at how schools and education have changed over time. We were lucky enough to have access to real historical sources that were from our school here in Heddon; photographs, school log books and even building plans. Our favourite source was the school log book from the 1880s as it detailed the punishment given to a pupil at Heddon School for 'subordination'!









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### Super Science in Year 4

In Science this week, we started our new Electricity unit. We began by identifying and sorting appliances, both electrical and non electrical. We discussed how some appliances require mains electricity and others work using batteries. The children created their own groupings to show this!







#### **Fairground Rides**

This week, Year 5 have been very busy with designing fairground rides using mechanical systems such as pulleys and gears. After a short discussion, the children decided on their final design and began creating their Carousels or Ferris Wheels. This has been great fun and the children have enjoyed planning, building and creating their designs.















## **Kasper, Prince of Cats**

After reading the beginning of our new text, "Kaspar, Prince of Cats", Year 6 children completed a visualisation session. Here, we retrieved information about one of the characters in the story (Countess Kandinsky) and made inferences about her personality. We then drew the character based upon this information.
