Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This topic will allow the children to begin to explore situations from different points of view. They will discuss how different characters might be feeling and will be encouraged to bring this into their play. Children will continue to be encouraged to share and take turns. They will find solutions to conflicts within their play and will become more confident with playing with other children.

Communication and Language

Through traditional tales, children will begin to listen to longer stories and will develop their ability to remember much of what happens. They will be encouraged to retell stories they have listened to, through their play.

<u>Literacy</u>

This topic will allow children to engage in extended conversations about stories and learn new vocabulary. This will develop their early enjoyment and understanding of stories by sharing and discussing their favourite books. They will be encouraged to mark make in a range of different ways and to use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. Some children may begin to write some letters accurately.

Physical Development

Children will continually be provided opportunities for play in both indoors and outdoors, to develop their fine and gross motor skills. They will continue to develop their core strength, spatial awareness and co-ordination through a variety of games. They will be encouraged to be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips. Within PE lessons, children will develop their ball skills and learn how to roll a ball, catch and throw a ball.

<u>Maths</u>

Children will learn to identify representations of 1, 2, 3 and 4. They will subitise or count to find out how many and make their own collections of 1, 2, 3 or 4 objects. Children will begin to use language to describe length and height.



Expressive Arts and Design

The children will continue to have weekly singing and music lessons with Mrs Milner. Children will be encouraged to become more independent when accessing resources. They will use different mediums, as well as joining different materials and exploring different textures. They will be encouraged to make imaginative 'small worlds', using the Traditional Tales we will be reading.

<u>Understanding of the</u> <u>World</u>

We will begin to explore what maps are and will create our own together, using stories.

The children will be encouraged to talk about changes they notice, through baking.
