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## Drawing using different Pressure in Year 1

In Year 1 the children have been drawing lines using different pressures in Art. The children drew around leaves using heavy pressure when drawing the outline line and then drew another line on the inside of that line using slightly less pressure. They continued to draw lines inside each leaf shape using lighter pressure each time until the leaf was full. Brilliant work Year 1!


## RE with Year 2

In RE this week, Year 2 loved reading the poem 'In the Beginning' by Steve Turner. We performed it in groups and thought very hard about what each line in the poem said. We discussed the importance of rest and finished our lesson with some relaxing starfish breathing.


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## Exploring Rocks in Year 3

Year 3 have been looking at metamorphic and igneous rocks. By applying heat and pressure, we managed to make our own layered metamorphic rock (using Fruitella sweets!). We have also compared the size of crystals within igneous rocks, using hand lenses, to explore whether those rocks cooled quickly or slowly when being formed.


## Visiting Arbeia with Year 4

This week Year 4 visited the Roman Fort, Arbeia in South Shields and we all had a fantastic day. The children began their day by learning how we know about the past as they took on the roles of archaeologists in the Time Quest. During their dig the children discovered everything from pottery shards to ancient building materials, and even fragments of bone that helped them understand what the Romans ate and how they lived their lives at Arbeia. We also had time to learn lots of facts in the museum and we explored the ruins whilst answering questions about the fort and the lives of the Roman who lived there. Later in the week we wrote a recount of our trip which the children are bringing home to share with you. We hope you enjoy reading about our day at Arbeia.


## Anglo Saxon Trade with Year 5

This week we have been learning all about Anglo Saxon trade. We have been creating play scripts and acting out our short scenes in front of the class. We enjoyed discussing the materials and items that would have been traded during this times and how we know. The children have been really engaged with the Anglo-Saxon unit this halt term

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## Creating Printing Blocks in Year 6

Year 6 has reached an exciting stage of this half term's art unit; carving! After deciding on their final tile design, and practising their technique using polystyrene blocks, the children used carving tools to translate their design onto polymer. The tools are very sharp, so working carefully was key in this lesson. Once the carved designs are completed next week, the children will use printing ink to transfer their images onto paper, in a repeated pattern, and form a William Morris style wallpaper. We look forward to sharing the finished product with you!
