History & Geography

Constructing our knowledge of the past through a range of sources, Year 6 will be exploring what life was like in the Victorian era for both the rich and poor. We will examine how the Industrial Revolution changed Britain and our geography work will focus on the British Empire.



PE: Year 6 will continue their weekly sessions with Mr Smith. This half term we will be focussing on dance. Across the half term, we will be building a routine to the well-known track "Waka Waka",

Maths

This term in maths we will learn about the order of operations, as well as practising our estimation and reasoning skills. We will be focussing in depth on fractions; simplifying, comparing, ordering and calculating, as well as converting between fractions and mixed numbers and finding fractions of amounts. We will also look at some geometry work around position and direction.

Science

During this half term, we will explore Evolution and Inheritance, learning to recognise that living things have changed over time. We will understand how fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. We will research the work of Charles Darwin and The Origin of Species which was published in the Victorian times.

Art & DT

In DT, we will design our own Christmas Advent calendar. After practising a variety of stitching and applique techniques, we will create our calendars in teams ready for the December countdown!

Computing

During this half term we will continue to complete our coding unit. Once finished, we will move onto our **blogging** unit. Here, the children will learn the basic principles of creating and maintaining a blog in a controlled and safe environment.

Our work in English in the run up to Christmas will centre around the life and times of Victorian author. Charles Dickens. We will be conducting a book study of the spooky novel, A Christmas Carol. Our spelling, punctuation and grammar objectives will be taught within the context of the book and our nonfiction work will explore the author's life as well as social and cultural aspects of Dickensian Britain.
