Year 7 Focus on Curriculum MATHS



We have worked closely with our primary schools to design our Year 7 curriculum to ensure progression from Key Stage 2. We believe that students should experience an ambitious and meaningful Key Stage 3 curriculum to enable them to develop deep knowledge and understanding in each curriculum area. This also enables them to develop their interests and skills that they may wish to pursue in KS4 or beyond.








Last half term our Maths focus was on number. We were building on Year 6 experience with the four operations. Year 7 includes more work with decimal, fractional and negative numbers as well as using algebraic notation.

For each of our topics, students have a tracker in their books. This helps them know what they are learning each day and can see how the sequence of lessons builds their knowledge, understanding and skills. Inside each tracker we have the core facts which

are the essentials we want our students to really focus on and a vocabulary bank to support their reasoning.

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Sparx Maths continues to be an important part of our curriculum, allowing students the time to individually practise, whilst being supported with

video helps and immediate feedback. Since the start of this year, students at Ponteland High have completed over 1 million questions online: this is an average of 800 questions per student. This is really helping to deepen their thinking and consolidate their learning.



Parallel Maths

This half term we will also be introducing Parallel Maths. This is an opportunity for students who have a drive to further develop their maths by joining an online community and working with other mathematicians from all over the country. This will involve a weekly live online seminar and then completing a maths puzzle independently. These students will be supported in school, but Parallel Maths is all completed in their own time.
