Physical Development

This half term the children will:

Continue to develop overall body strength, coordination, balance and agility through physical activities and building obstacle courses

Understand how to stay safe in the dark and to cross roads safely

Develop balance skills through the use of two wheeled vehicles

Begin to form recognisable letters

Use a range of tools competently, safely and efficiently



Communication, Language and Literacy

Children will continue to interact with others, negotiating plans and activities, take turns in conversation and will be encouraged to speak clearly and audibly with confidence and control. Children will listen to and explore selected non-fiction, fiction and poetry texts, responding to what they have heard by relevant comments, questions or actions. Children will continue to learn to blend phonemes to read simple words and to learn some words by sight. They will practise letter formation patterns and how to accurately write their names.

Expressive Arts and Design

Understanding of the World

This topic offers many opportunities for the children to make comparisons about where they and others live. They can explore the differences and similarities between homes around the world and of the present and the past. Children will:

Investigate pictures, stories and artefacts identifying similarities and differences

Have hands on experience visiting the local area to explore different types of buildings and places of interest

Explore basic chronology – recognising that things happened before they were born

Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries

Recognise special times and events

Begin to understand that people have different beliefs and celebrate in different ways
