



We continue to focus on attendance and punctuality so please remember that our School starts at 8.55am (9am for Nursery) and anyone arriving after this time will be marked as late.

We have had a great week making potions, matching Autumn colours and looking at repeating patterns. We all loved celebrating Miss Smith's special birthday too!








Keeping Safe with Year 1






Sewing Roman Bullas in Year 4




The Power of Words with Year 5








All about the Vikings in Year 6!
