

## History & Geography

This term, we will learn to describe and understand key aspects of Physical Geography including **volcanoes and earthquakes**, looking at plate tectonics and the ring of fire.

## PE:

We will be completing a dance unit this half term in PE, with a particular focus on Street Dance. Our PE days will now be Tuesdays and Thursdays, with Tuesday sessions being lead by the NUFC foundation.

## Maths

In maths we will be studying algebra, decimals as fractions (and vice versa) and calculating with decimals up to three decimal places. We will then move on to looking at percentages, exploring equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages and finding percentages of amounts. We will also frequently practise our arithmetic skills, with an added homework focus on this, too.

## Science

In science, pupils will be learning about the **circulatory system** and how it helps keep our bodies alive and healthy. They will explore the **heart, blood, and blood vessels**, and learn how these work together to transport oxygen, nutrients, and water around the body. Children will also investigate the different **components of blood** and their roles in keeping us healthy.

## Computing:

This half term the children will be developing their coding skills using Scratch and 2Code. They will have the opportunity to retell an event and create their own game.



## Art & DT

In music, we will be exploring metre. Metre refers to the regularly recurring patterns and accents such as bars and beats.
